Congratulations!

You have been selected as a 2026 citizen to the American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) Missouri Girls State. The session is held at Lindenwood University in St. Charles MO from June 20-27, 2026.

The Girls State program has been designed and sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary since 1940. It is a unique learning experience for approximately 800 young women who have completed their junior year of high school.

Citizens selected by the American Legion Auxiliary and high school educators will learn about our democracy through hands-on experience. Citizens will be challenged to use initiative and imagination to create their ideal city, county, and state government.

Constructing a representative government from scratch is not easy. You will be challenged to voice your opinion, but seek compromise with your fellow citizens. Overcoming that challenge will be difficult, but that's what makes participation in ALA Missouri Girls State worthwhile.

If you get involved in the week's activities, you will leave ALA Missouri Girls State a more powerful young woman than when you arrived. You will know that you have the capability to change your school, your city, your county, your state, your country, and even the world for the better. You will have new energy and passion for your future. We look forward to watching you undergo this transformation.



Citizens must remain at ALA MGS for the entire session, which begins Saturday, June 20th, until the program's conclusion on Saturday, June 21st, at approximately 10:30 am. Students who leave ALA MGS before the last scheduled activity will not receive a certificate of completion for the program.

This means the student **cannot add ALA MGS to college applications and will not be eligible to receive college credit from Lindenwood University** because the required hours of attendance have not been met. Exceptions to this rule are considered due to emergencies, and the ALA MGS Director reserves the right to grant such exceptions. Money will not be refunded to the sponsor or contributing organization if the citizen does not complete the entire program.

If you cannot attend, you must contact ALA MGS Headquarters at headquarters@missourigirlsstate.org or call Director of Admissions, Megan Wilson at (628) 252-6471 as soon as possible. This will allow the ALA MGS Headquarters Staff to notify the local sponsors to allow an alternate to attend. Emailing your school counselor stating that you cannot attend **does not** notify the program. No refunds will be issued in these situations.

We look forward to meeting you and know that your stay at the American Legion Auxiliary Missouri Girls State will be an experience you will long remember!

ALA MISSOURI GIRLS STATE ORIENTATION

Why is Orientation Important?

Orientation provides you a quick overview of what to expect the week of ALA MGS. It is an opportunity for both you and your adult caregiver to ask any questions you may have about the week.

Is Orientation Required?

Yes! It is *required* for you to attend one session.

This can be an *in-person* orientation or *virtual* option. It is *strongly encouraged* for your adult caregiver to attend the session with you.

If a selected citizen (that's you!) does not meet the requirement of completing orientation by **June 10, 2026** you will automatically forfeit your opportunity to attend ALA Missouri Girls State.

Where is Orientation Held?

There are two options for orientation - in person or virtual. In person orientations are held across the state in an effort to provide options for most citizens to attend in close proximity to their residence. If you cannot attend an in person orientation, please review and sign up for a virtual orientation.

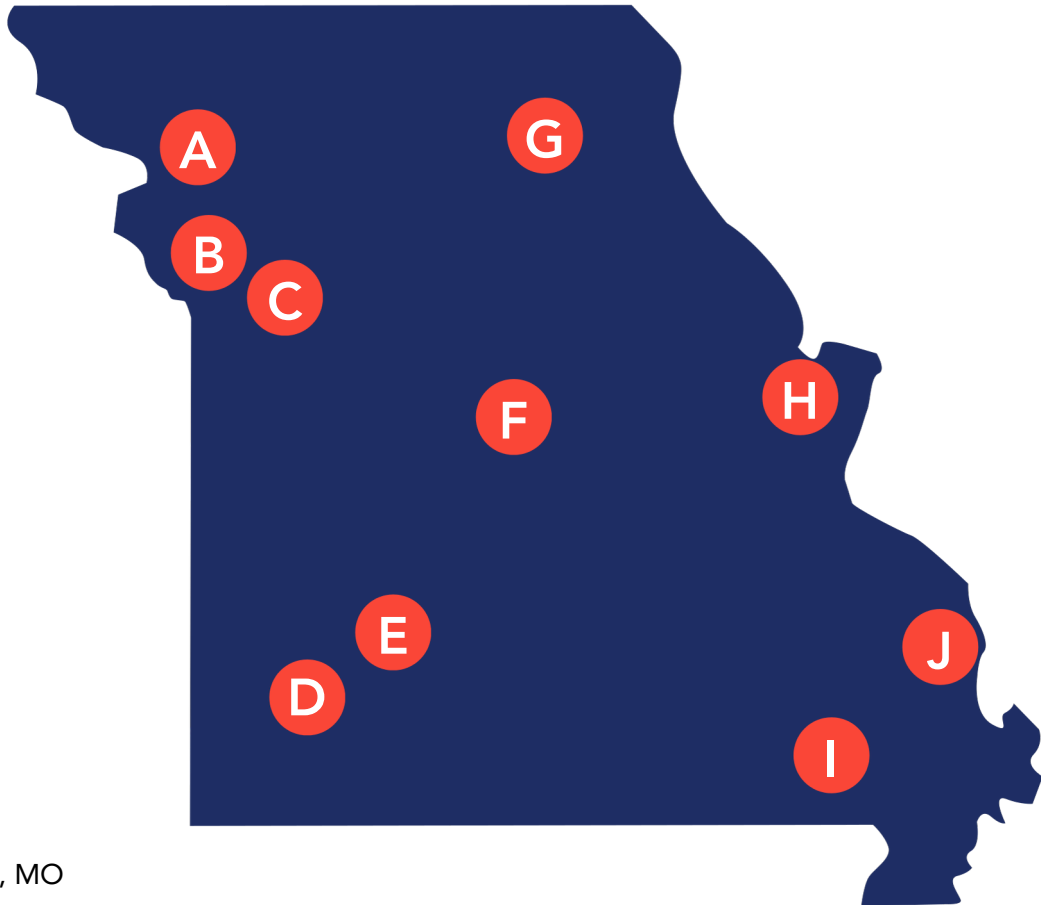

A city consists of approximately 50 citizens. Citizens will be divided into two wholly fictional political parties, **Nationalists** and **Federalists**.

During the week, citizens will participate in elections and City, County, and State activities.

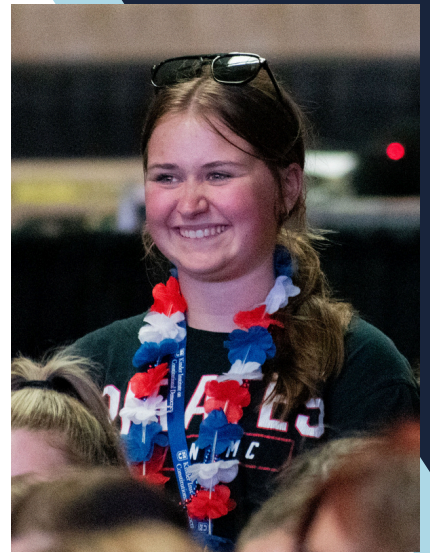

PARTY AFFILIATION



There are two political parties at ALA MGS. These parties are entirely fictional and have no relation to real life political parties.

Nationalist Party

- Represented by the color blue
- Mascot - bluebird (Missouri's State Bird!)

Federalist Party

- Represented by the color red
- Mascot - dogwood tree (Missouri's State Tree!)

Each citizen is randomly assigned to a party. Your roommate will generally belong to the opposite party.

Citizens work within their parties to campaign for their candidates, promote party spirit, and create their party platform.

There are opportunities to work within your party at the city, county, and state level.

3 BRANCHES OF GOVERNMENT

Just like in real life, there are three branches of government:

- Executive
- Legislative
- Judicial

All three levels of government (city, county, state) have functional executive, legislative, and judicial branches.

SCHOOLS OF INSTRUCTION

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SCHOOLS OF INSTRUCTION

Each citizen must enroll in one of the nine classes held daily from Sunday through Thursday. These classes will be introduced and explained in the orientation assembly on Sunday morning.

Class choices will include:

- School of Commerce
- School of Journalism & Media
- School of Education
- School of International Affairs
- School of Law
- School of Law Enforcement
- School of Legislative and Executive Policy
- School of Local Government
- School of Campaigning and Political Operations.

Each class will have an exam on Friday. Passing a final exam and participating in ALA MGS may make you eligible for college credit from Lindenwood University. **These are not automatic credits for attending ALA MGS.** The exam scores and online participation forms (completed by each citizen) are given to the University, and they evaluate each citizen's record for the week to determine eligibility for college credit. The University will make this determination at the end of July 2026, and **you will receive notification of your eligibility for credit via email and text message, both of which will be sent using the information you have provided ALA MGS.**

You will be living in a college dormitory while at ALA MGS!

The set up of the residence halls vary. You may be in a suite style room, with two rooms having a shared restroom. You may be in a community style residence hall where multiple rooms share one restroom in a hallway.

You will have one or two roommates sharing the room with you. You will not know your roommate until arrival at ALA MGS - we do our best to pair you with someone from a different part of the state.

Your roommate will also be of a differing ALA MGS political party.

Each dorm has a house mom. These are your "moms" for the week who will serve as friendly face during the week. They also can make Wal-Mart runs for necessities during the week - cash only!

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR AT ALA MGS?

The dress code is not intended to deter individuality or creativity but rather to teach executive presence and prepare all citizens for professional dress experiences in the future. Please be mindful of the dress code policy and plan accordingly for your session at ALA MGS.

The following dress code expectations **apply at all times:**

- All tops and dresses must have two straps (of any width)
- Shoes must be worn any time you are outside of your dorm room
- No sheer or see-through clothing
- No extra exposure - this includes low cuts, cut-outs, halter tops, or crop tops
- Skirt and dress hemlines should rest near the end of fingertips when arms are resting at your side

DAYTIME DRESS

During the daytime, we observe a casual dress code. Citizens can wear jeans, leggings, t-shirts, athletic skorts, dresses, tank tops, ball caps, and more. We suggest you wear comfortable shoes as you will travel long distances. The temperature can vary greatly (warm outdoors and cold indoor environments), so we suggest having a light jacket or sweater with you.

- Citizens have the opportunity to participate in athletic activities Saturday evening, Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday mornings. If you wish to participate, please bring athletic wear and tennis shoes.

EVENING/STAGE DRESS

During our evening assemblies, we ask all of our citizens and staff to display a professional look in their attire. This gives all participants an opportunity to practice the soft skill of a business casual dress code in a comfortable, supportive environment. Citizens should wear comfortable shoes and can vary in their attire to include dress pants, khakis, colored denim, dresses, blouses, blazers, pantusuits, and jumpsuits. Participants may NOT wear shorts, blue jeans, or rompers of any style for evening/stage dress code.

- Plan for 4 business casual outfits
- If you are running for a statewide position, we recommend an additional outfit (5) to be prepared for additional on-stage opportunities.
- If you serve in the ALA MGS House of Representatives or Senate, you will have the opportunity to travel to Jefferson City. It is the dress code of the capitol (not ALA MGS), to have shoulders covered. So, pack a sweater or blazer to plan accordingly.

INAUGURATION DRESS

On Friday evening, ALA Missouri Grls State concludes our governmental activities with an inauguration of the newly elected statewide officials. During the evening, citizens and staff will wear ALL BLACK business casual attire for the ceremony. Together, our goal is creating a look of uniformity amongst the whole program.

- Plan an all-black dress, suit, skirt and blouse, pants and blouse, or other appropriate solid black business-casual outfit
- Shoes should be black, neutral, or muted colors
- Accessories should be minimal or understated

WHAT NOT TO BRING

Do not bring any campaign materials of any kind – blank or printed.

This includes markers, scissors, glue, crayons, streamers, poster boards, etc. You will purchase these items with ALA MGS Bucks, which will be provided. This gives equal opportunity to all. You will be disqualified from running for office if you do not abide by these rules.

Lindenwood University is a tobacco free campus. Participants and guests are not allowed to possess tobacco or tobacco-like products including e-cigarettes and/or vaps.

Helpful Tip: Pack Light!

Unfortunately, not all dorms will have elevator access! Please keep this in mind as you are packing as you might have to carry your belongings up several flights of stairs. If you ride the ALA MGS provided busses, you will be limited in luggage items to ensure room for all passengers.

OTHER INFORMATION

What we need to know about you!

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DIETARY RESTRICTIONS

Dietary Restrictions (including gluten-free, diabetic, food allergies, etc.) should also be reported to ALA Missouri Girls State so arrangements can be made with Lindenwood University food services.

On the ALA MGS App, you must respond by providing information about any dietary restrictions including food allergies. Responses must be completed in the app by **June 10, 2026**. If you are vegetarian, you do not need to report it on the app. All meals will contain a vegetarian option.

If you responded that you **DO** have any dietary restrictions, we encourage you to stop by the Spellmann Center following registration in your residence hall. Lindenwood's food service will be available at this table to ensure you are aware of any special directions to meet your needs.

If your restriction is more severe, please email headquarters@missourigirlsstate.org as soon as possible.



MEDICAL

It is imperative that the ALA MGS staff be made aware of any medical issues that could affect participants during the session. **Please understand that attendance at ALA MGS can be physically and mentally strenuous, so we want to ensure the environment is safe for all of our participants.** Citizens and staff must walk to various locations at multiple times of the day. This can include longer distances across campus and in various weather conditions (heat, rain, etc).

All participants should complete the “Special Accomodation Needs” in the ALA MGS App as soon as possible. This can include recent updates to medical status (surgery, crutches, etc) in addition to diagnosed medical conditions. Responses **MUST** be reported in the app by June 10, 2026.

The ALA MGS program has volunteer staff members that are medical professionals as well as mental health/wellness professionals to assist as needed during the week. At any point that we feel a participant is no longer able to attend the program, we will work with the parent/guardian to ensure a safe departure from the program.

Over the counter basic medication (tums, tylenol, benadryl) will be available for purchase at the ALA MGS Shoppe. No participant is allowed to administer or distribute medications to fellow ALA MGS citizens.



EDUCATIONAL ACCOMMODATIONS

We are here to work in partnership with each participant that attends ALA MGS.

If you require educational accommodations, such as a 504 or IEP, please notify the program via the Special Accommodation Needs question on the ALA MGS App. If additional documentation is required to be filed with the University, we will notify you via email or phone call.

ALA MGS needs to receive advance notice regarding these accommodations to ensure they are appropriately provided. Failing to give timely notice may lead to the inability to offer the necessary educational accommodations.



TALENT SHOW AUDITIONS

On Wednesday of ALA Missouri Girls State, citizens of the current year's session will be featured in a Talent Show. In order to participate, you must send an audition via video by the **Sunday night of ALA Girls State (June 21st)**. Your submission must be a video of the exact act you plan on performing. Wear your costume in your video if you plan on performing in costume (dress code need not apply to talent show outfits).

Past acts have included singing, dancing (tap, ballet, jazz, and pointe), cheerleading or pom routines, twirling, flags, juggling, instrumental music, piano, dramatic or humorous monologues, inspirational spoken word, or other creative entries. Any person submitting an audition should bring their performance items with them to ALA Missouri Girls State.

Audition entries should be e-mailed to ALA MGS Music Director Miss Lynnea at lynnea.wootten@gmail.com. Upon submission, please include the title of your song and artist and the music you would need if selected to perform. This music should be submitted in MP3 format. If your music is too large of an attachment, please share the music via a Google Drive link.

ARRIVAL TO ALA MGS

Registration is from 12:30 pm to 3:30 pm in your assigned residence hall at Lindenwood University, and the first meeting will begin at 4:00 pm. On **Friday June 19th**, you will receive an email with your assigned residence hall. This will allow you to check in at your specific residence hall. We will also be able to assist you upon arrival if you do not know your assignment.

From Interstate 70, take Exit 228 at Missouri Highway 94 East/South 1st Capitol Drive. Continue Northeast on 1st Capitol Drive. Travel past Tompkins Street (by Auto Zone) and take the next left at 1st Capitol Drive to enter the Lindenwood University Campus. Follow the road past the Library and Academic Resource Center and turn right on John Weber Drive. You will then turn left and park in the parking areas if you are assigned to Blanton Hall, Rauch Memorial Hall, Calvert Rogers Hall, and Guffey Hall. If you are assigned to Irwin Hall, you will turn right to the parking area. The arrival map and schedule will be provided to you in weekly e-mail communications.

Once you reach the campus, be sure to look for and follow signs specifically for ALA MGS. Once you have parked in the above-mentioned parking lot, you may unload your luggage and check in to your residence hall with your city counselor.

After going through registration, the citizen may not leave the campus for any reason. Please plan to eat before arrival.



DEPARTURE FROM ALA MGS

On the last day, citizens will be packed up prior to attending the closing ceremony.

After closing ceremony (approx. 10:30 am), citizens are ready to be checked out with guardians and/or load up on busses to head home. Any concern about departure times must be sent to ALA MGS via email at headquarters@missourigirlsstate.org. Only pre-approved early departures will be eligible for college credit consideration and successful completion of the program.

We **STRONGLY** recommend that citizens do not drive themselves to or from ALA MGS. This is a long and tiring week. We care about the safety of our citizens, and they will be too tired to safely drive home after a week of building a government from scratch!

If your citizen does drive themselves to/from the session, they will turn in their keys for the Missouri State Highway Patrol troopers (that are also ALA MGS Staff members) to monitor during the week.



BUS INFORMATION

If you live more than 90 miles from Lindenwood University in St. Charles, you are eligible for bus transportation TO and FROM the ALA Missouri Girls State session. **This is provided at no additional cost to you - the participant!**

On the ALA MGS App, you will see a list of planned launch sites throughout the state. **You must respond in the ALA MGS app by May 20, 2026 for us to plan transportation opportunities accordingly.**

Please note that we calculate occupancy and routes based on the benefit of ALL riders. You will be assigned a bus that fits in the overall transportation plan for both the ALA MGS and MBS participants who are riding on the transportation. The bus stop for your arrival or departure may NOT be the bus location nearest to your home address.
